Please accept this invitation and plan to attend this landmark event.


There will be items for sale as well as on display. In addition, complementary coffee and cookies will be served.



The Youth Storefront Project has a home! We are located in suite # 200 at the west end of the old Louis Hotel (118 S. 5th Ave.) on Arizona Alley. We are occupying a large 2000 sq. ft. space which will function as display space, retail space, gallery space, and performance space. This will be a multifunctional space! Currently we are in the process of cleaning, fixing, and decorating the Storefront.

Storefront Grants

The Youth Storefront Project was a recipient of a \$2,000.00 grant from Pima Prevention Project this past August. These monies have helped us secure the space for the Storefront and will provide "start up" funds for projects designed by youth.

Also, local artist, M.L. Lincoln has securred a grant from the Tucson Arts Coalition and the Arizona Commission on the Arts. The one thousand dollar grant will be used to develope a photography program at the school.
